3. Introducing a new cat into the care facility and AAI-program

When a new AAI-cat arrives at the facility, he or she not only has to get used to his or her new role as AAI-cat, but also needs to adjust to the new environment, the unfamiliar cats and the caregivers in the facility.

Let the cat gradually grow accustomed to the new surroundings and caregivers and evaluate if this is proceeding well. Afterwards you introduce the new cat to the other cats.

The new cat must be introduced gradually to the resident cat group:

- Provide three rooms: an AAI-room, a resting area for the cat group and a separate room for the new cat.
- For several days the new cat remains in the separate room without visual contact with the cat group.
- Introduce the scent of the new cat in the resident cat group by giving them a cloth with the smell of the new cat (e.g. bedding material..). This action should be accompanied by something positive, such as food.
- Let the cats gradually grow accustomed to each other by visual contact (e.g. glass door).
- o Afterwards you introduce the new cat progressively into the cat group.
- A successful introduction of a new cat includes evaluation of stress behaviour of the cats at every step.

A test period is more than recommended, for some individuals the adaptation process might only take a few days or weeks, whereas others may never be able to adapt. In these cases the new cat should be accommodated elsewhere.

Provide sufficient escape routes and hiding space (number of cats +2).
